CSCMP's Fundamentals of Supply Chain Management Workshop Qualifies for Module Waiver in ASTL Certification

Lombard, Illinois USA (May 17, 2010)—The Council of Supply Chain Management Professionals (CSCMP) announced that completion of its Fundamentals of Supply Chain Management workshop will qualify as a waiver for the Logistics Systems Management module in the Certification in Transportation and Logistics (CTL) program offered by the American Society of Transportation and Logistics, Inc. (ASTL). The workshop will be held June 14-15, 2010 in Lombard, Illinois.

The Fundamentals of Supply Chain Management workshop is a two-day educational event developed for a wide range of audiences, including individuals new to the industry, senior-level managers with supply chain responsibilities, and non-supply chain professionals involved in supply chain-related functions.

Highly interactive sessions taught by industry veterans Art van Bodegraven and Kenneth B. Ackerman will enable participants to gain a broader understanding of the key role that supply chain management plays in organizations and its impact on all aspects of business. Topics will explore supply chain integration, reverse logistics, information systems, transportation, procurement, inventory management, and warehousing.

Upon completion of the Fundamentals of Supply Chain Management workshop, CSCMP will issue a Certificate of Completion to participants, which is required in order to receive the waiver from ASTL.
